Thank you for your interest in hosting a diaper drive for A Family Place. Increasing access to diapers is a fun and easy way to provide a much needed resource for families in our community who are caring for Yamhill County's youngest residents.

Mothers with limited access to diapers have reported more difficulty with stress management, depression and general coping skills, all of which are proven to have negative effects on young children. Furthermore, children without an adequate diaper supply cannot attend early childhood classrooms or daycare, greatly reducing their parent's ability to work. By organizing a diaper drive through A Family Place you are building a community in which families have what they need to thrive. **Thank you!**

Steps to Hosting a Diaper Drive

1. We Can Help!

Before you start, please let us know you plan on holding a diaper drive by completing the host agreement form. A member of our team can schedule a time to share with your organization or group about the need for emergency diapers and the benefits of relief nursery services in our community. We can also tell you if we are low on specific sizes and help publicize your drive.

2. Choose a Time

Plan on holding your diaper drive for at least a week, and maybe as long as three weeks, so people have time to donate. You can also tie your drive to a holiday or event already planned in your community, such as a school fair, community festival or library book sale.

3. Set a Goal

A child needs 8-10 diapers a day. Set a goal to diaper a newborn in need for a month (300 diapers), three months (900 diapers), or a year (3,650).

4. Decide How to Collect Diapers

Contributions can be brought to a regularly scheduled meeting, given to a specific person in an organization, or dropped at a collection site. (Collection sites should be visible and accessible to many people - you might have donations from outside of your organization!) A Family Place has play-n-packs available for loan to use as collections bins.

5. Get the Word Out

There are tons of free ways to advertise:

- Use the social networking world —send emails, post your drive on Facebook and Twitter, ask your friends to share it with their friends.
- Ask those with children to contact teachers to see if their class can bring diapers to contribute to your drive. Some teachers will add information to their newsletter as well.
- If your diaper drive will be held in your workplace, hang signs in high-traffic areas, or gathering spaces.
- One of the best ways to advertise is still word of mouth — talk about the drive to anyone and everyone!

Be sure to include the dates you are collecting diapers and the location of your drop site(s).

6. Collect and Tally the Diapers

Once the diapers are collected, tally the total using the spreadsheet provided and share the results with everyone who participated!

Encourage a "Next Time"

- Refer to your results in terms of "this time we collected"
- Send thank you notes to all who helped make the drive a success
- Start planning your next diaper drive!

Who needs a change?

Parents, children and our community all experience positive change when we increase access to diapers for local families.

Parents

- 1 in 3 moms report they do not have an adequate supply of diapers
- Diapers for one child cost families an average of \$18/week
- The pain that a parent or caregiver feels when they are not able to meet their children's basic needs adds stress and tension to the already difficult task of parenting; many mothers report a lack of diapers is more distressing to them than a lack of food.

Children

- Babies exposed to stressful environments for long periods of time are affected negatively both emotionally and physically.
- Families that are not able to afford an adequate supply of clean diapers often leave their babies in a single diaper all day, which can result in diaper rash and other detrimental health issues.
- Excessive crying, often the result of diaper rash or discomfort, is frequently cited as an underlying cause of child abuse.

Communities

- Children without an adequate diaper supply are often unable to enroll in early childhood classrooms or daycares that require a family to supply diapers, thus reducing a parent's ability to work.
- A history of abuse and neglect is common in children accessing special education services and foster care, in addition to adults held in a county, state and federal prison systems.



99% require no foster care

90% develop at age-appropriate levels

63% increase in parents reading to their children
